

Are small lithium batteries allowed on planes





Overview

Spare (uninstalled) lithium metal batteries and lithium ion batteries, portable rechargers, electronic cigarettes and vaping devices are prohibited in checked baggage. They must be carried with the passenger in carry-on baggage. Can you take a lithium ion battery on a plane?

Spare lithium batteries must be carried in carry-on baggage only and must be individually protected so as to prevent short circuits. Power banks are considered as spare lithium batteries and must be completely switched off in flight. Lithium ion batteries: the Watt-hour rating must not exceed 100 Wh.

Can you bring a battery on a plane?

Requirements vary based on the type of device and size of battery. Spare (uninstalled) lithium metal batteries and lithium ion batteries, portable rechargers, electronic cigarettes and vaping devices are prohibited in checked baggage. They must be carried with the passenger in carry-on baggage.

What types of batteries can you carry on a plane?

Passengers may carry all consumer-sized lithium ion batteries (up to 100 watt hours per battery). This size covers AA, AAA, cell phone, PDA, camera, camcorder, handheld game, tablet, portable drill, and standard laptop computer batteries. The watt hours (Wh) rating is marked on newer lithium ion batteries and is explained in #3 below.

Can a lithium battery be carried by air?

You can prepare them for travel by: Whether a lithium battery can be carried by air or not depends on its configuration and its Watt-hour (Wh) rating (for rechargeable lithium-ion/polymer batteries) or Lithium Content (LC) (for non-rechargeable lithium metal batteries).

Can lithium batteries cause a fire on a plane?

Smoke and fire incidents involving lithium batteries can be mitigated by the



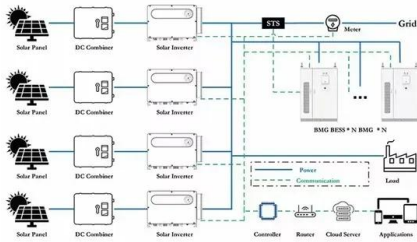
cabin crew and passengers inside the aircraft cabin. If carry-on baggage is checked at the gate or planeside, spare lithium batteries, electronic cigarettes, and vaping devices must be removed from the baggage and kept with the passenger in the aircraft cabin.

Can lithium ion batteries be shipped on a cargo aircraft?

All shipments of lithium metal batteries and lithium ion batteries when shipped by themselves, i.e., when not packed with the equipment the battery powers or installed in equipment, are restricted to carriage on a cargo aircraft.

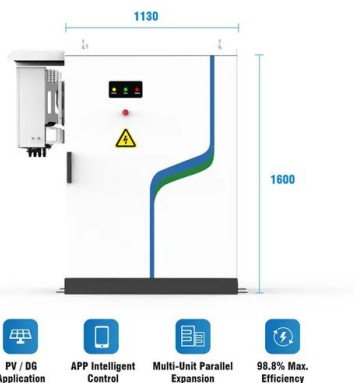

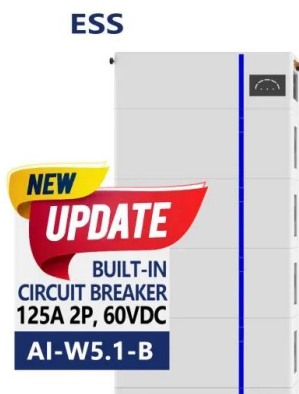
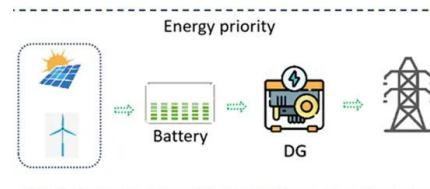

Lithium batteries with more than 100 watt hours

Spare (uninstalled) lithium ion and lithium metal batteries, including power banks and cell phone battery charging cases, must be carried in carry-on baggage only. With airline approval, passengers may also carry up to two spare larger lithium ion batteries (101-160 Wh) or lithium metal batteries (2-8 grams).



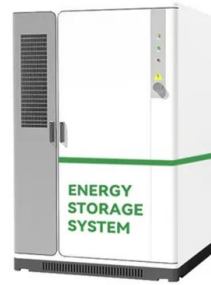

Travelling with batteries, power banks & battery-operated devices

Find information on which batteries, power banks and battery-operated devices are allowed on a plane and how to pack them safely. All batteries count toward your 20 battery limit. That includes dry cell alkaline and nickel-based batteries. You can carry up to two lithium batteries rated 100-160Wh or 2-8g of lithium content.



Can you bring portable chargers on a plane? 3 TSA rules

Generally, batteries used to power small electronic devices are allowed in both carry-on and checked luggage. These include AA, AAA, C, and D, as well as 9-volt and button-size battery types. Besides, one may take rechargeable batteries such as NiMH or NiCad, which are commonly used in devices such as flashlights or emergency medical equipment.



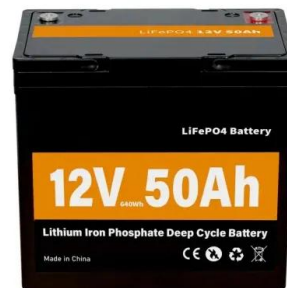

These limits allow for nearly all types of lithium batteries used by the average person in their electronic devices. With airline approval, passengers may also carry up to two spare larger lithium ion batteries (101-160 Wh) or Lithium metal batteries (2-8 grams).



Dangerous Goods Information

Batteries containing more than 0.3 g of lithium or with a capacity of over 2.7 Watt-hours may not be checked in nor carried onboard. Removable lithium batteries: Capacity of the lithium battery must be lower than 160 Watt-hours: If the smart baggage is checked

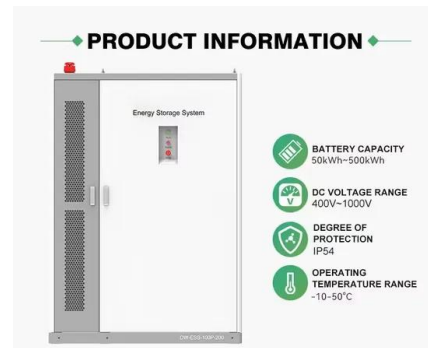


Restricted and prohibited items , Information , British Airways

Lithium metal batteries must not exceed 2g lithium content and lithium-ion batteries must not exceed 100Wh. Important note: If your cabin bag is checked in or removed at the gate and placed in the hold, you must remove all spare batteries and power banks and carry them with you in ...

What Batteries Are Allowed On A Plane?

This size covers larger extended-life laptop batteries. Most consumer lithium ion batteries are below this size. Lithium ion batteries that are between 101 - 160 wh are allowed in carry-on bags with airline approval. Lithium metal batteries (a.k.a.: non-rechargeable

Can I Bring A Lithium Battery On A Plane? Know The Rules!

What types of lithium batteries are allowed on a plane? Most lithium batteries are allowed on planes, including lithium-ion (Li-ion) and lithium metal batteries, as long as they are intended for personal use, such as those in laptops, smartphones, and cameras.

All other battery restrictions still apply e.g. no more than two spare lithium batteries exceeding 100Wh and up to 160Wh, are permitted and forms part of the total carried. A combination of batteries may be carried e.g. 10 x 98Wh lithium ion + 2 x 138Wh lithium ion + 2 x 12V and 98Wh non-spillable + 6 x alkaline.



Understanding The Ban: Why No Lithium Batteries On Planes

While lithium batteries are generally not allowed on planes, there are some exceptions for smaller batteries. Passengers are typically allowed to carry certain types of lithium batteries in their carry-on luggage, such as lithium-ion batteries used in personal electronic devices like smartphones and laptops.

Are Camera Batteries Allowed On Planes?

Any lithium batteries brought into the cabin should be under 100 watt hours (wh). Most camera batteries are well under 100 watts hours capacity. There is no limit to the number of spare batteries that you can bring in your carry on bags if they are under 100 wh



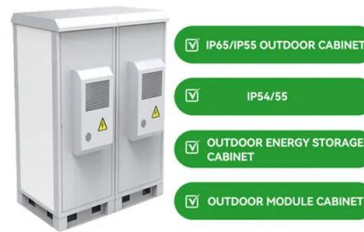
Power Banks

Portable chargers or power banks containing a lithium ion battery must be packed in carry-on bags. For more information, see the FAA guidance on portable rechargers. Power Banks , Transportation Security Administration



What items can I travel with , Civil Aviation Authority

Spare batteries for medical electronic devices containing lithium metal batteries exceeding 2 grams but not exceeding 8 grams, or lithium ion batteries exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh. No more than two individually protected spare batteries per person may be carried.

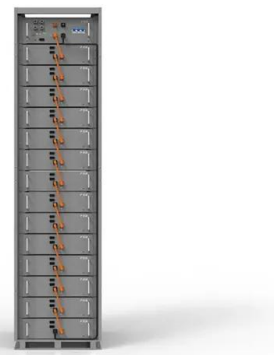


Battery or Fuel-Powered Items

Lithium ion batteries not installed in a device (spares) must be in carry-on baggage and no more than two (2) spares between 100 and 160-watt hours are allowed. Quantity Limits for Lithium Batteries: Each person is limited to a maximum of 20 spare batteries.

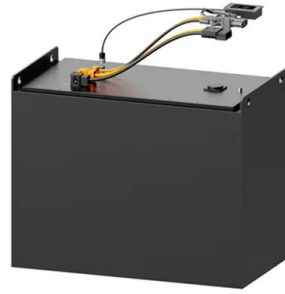
Cathay Pacific passengers are not allowed to bring small vehicles running on lithium ion batteries onto the aircraft, per our guidelines. If these items are brought to the airport they will be refused at check-in, and it will be the passenger's responsibility to arrange the disposal of such banned ...
