Can a multiple vote system alter electoral outcomes in all parliamentary systems?



We use simulations to examine how a multiple vote system could alter electoral outcomes in all possible parliamentary systems. We find that multiple vote systems act centripetally in multiple dimensions too, though weakly in extreme cases where parties are sorted into ideological clusters at opposite corners of the ideological space.

Is a multiple vote electoral system centripetal?

Multiple vote electoral systems: a remedy. We examine the mechanical effect of a multiple vote, proportional representation electoral system on party vote share in n dimensions. In one dimension, Cox (1990) has proven that such a system is centripetal: it drives parties to the center of the political spectrum.

What is a mixed electoral system?

Dozens of countries have introduced mixed electoral systems or other multi-tier electoral systems, combining seats elected according to different sets of rules, while others require parties to gain a certain share of national votes to qualify for the allocation of seats ('legal thresholds').

Do multi-level electoral systems entail a bottom-up volatility spillover?

More generally, the evidence indicates that multi-level electoral systems in which subnational and national electoral cycles are unsynchronized can entail additional electoral costs and benefits in the form of bottom-up volatility spillovers.

Do electoral systems offer political parties equal access to Parliament?

The question as to whether given electoral systems offer political parties, regardless of their size, equal access to parliament, has been assessed either by analysing electoral outcomes, or by studying electoral rules.

How do electoral systems work?

E.g., some electoral systems function almost like perfect PR (with compensatory proportional seats in upper tiers), but with legal thresholds embedded, so that small parties are excluded from the proportional seat allocation part.

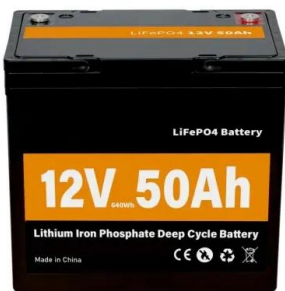

- Don't have to have a majority to win (not proportional & lack legitimacy) - Can lead to an elective dictatorship - Leads to wasted votes - Only winning party is represented - MPs can be elected with as little as 30% of the vote (Kensington Cons got 38.3%, Lab got 38%) - Votes have to be concentrated to be successful - Safe seats are very unlikely to change
